Officers with the York Regional Police Major Fraud Unit are seeking public assistance in identifying a suspect wanted in regards to a fraud in the Town of Aurora.





On Thursday, November 6, 2014 at 3:17 p.m. the suspect attended the Scotia Bank located at 15420 Bayview Avenue in Aurora and opened a bank account posing as a client from Alberta. The client's information was confirmed with fraudulent documents that the suspect provided. The suspect was then able to

obtain a new account and debit card that were linked to the real customers line of credit in Alberta. She then attended nine different Scotia Bank locations the same day and withdrew a total of \$53,700 from the client's account.





## THE SUSPECT IS DESCRIBED AS:

Female, White, approximately 35 - 45 years of age, 5'4", 180 lbs., with auburn hair pulled back in a bun and wearing glasses.
