

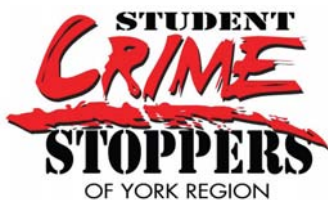

January is Crime Stoppers Month around the world and this year we are bringing attention to bullying. It has been two years since we partnered with each of the school boards to promote the use of Crime Stoppers to report bullying incidents when students do not feel comfortable reporting it to school staff or their parents. Statistics show that in 57% of cases bullying stops within ten seconds of someone speaking up. Crime Stoppers of York Region celebrated the month with a press conference where our new initiatives were launched. This past year we launched the use of Twitter to reach another sector of the community to help solve unsolved crimes and to promote upcoming events along with fundraisers. At this year's event our distinguished speakers included York Regional Police Deputy Chief, Tom Carrique, Crime Stoppers International Past President, Gary Murphy, Crime Stoppers of York Region Chair, Joseph Ng and Dave Forster, Vice President of the Ontario Association of Crime Stoppers and Director for Crime Stoppers of York Region and Dr. Joanne Cummings, the Director of Knowledge Mobilization with PREVNET. PREVNET is a national network of Canadian researchers, non-governmental organizations and governments committed to stop bullying. Bullying is wrong and hurtful. Every child and youth has the right to be safe and free from involvement in bullying. It affects children and youth who are bullied, those who bully others, and those who know it is going on.

In 2011 we had another successful year statistically again in York Region. This past year we received 1532 tips and our tipsters helped the police arrest 146 people, lay 349 criminal charges, recover \$20,344,885 in stolen property, seize 22 weapons from the hands of criminals and seize \$5,592,609 in illegal drugs many of which were being dealt and grown in our residential neighbourhoods. This past year Crime Stoppers of York Region approved almost \$38,000 in rewards to be paid to our tipsters. Without the financial support of our sponsors and individual donations these successes would not have been possible. Thank you to our supporters continued financial support. Your support allows us to help keep York Region a safer place. (continued on page 2)



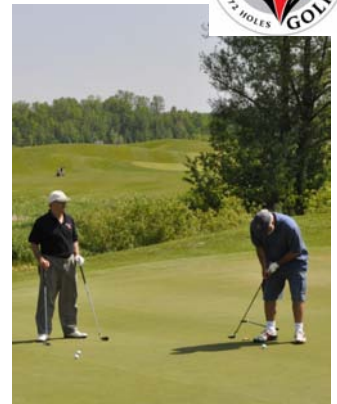
